


Morning Worship

...To stand every morning to thank and praise the LORD, and likewise at even. 1 Chr. 23:30; Ps. 92:1-2


Let every thing that hath breath praise the Lord. Praise ye the Lord. 150:6

3. Start the wave of mu-sic roll-ing On the soft-ly float-ing breeze; Join the feath-ered song-sters'




good-ness, Which we here with rap-ture tell. Oh, we love Him and a-dore Him—Wor-ship

war-ble, As they sing a-mong the trees. Wake the song of in-spir-a-tion, Ere we




Him in song and prayer— As we hum-bly wait be-fore Him, We His right-eous-ness de-clare.
