Christ Jesus... took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men:


And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. Php. 2:5-8




1. Down from the glo - ry of Fa - ther's shin - ing king - dom,
